

Timeline - Preliminary Itinerary Worksheet (Wedding on the Sternwheeler Rose)



	B & G Board :30 prior to Sailing
	Guests Board :15 prior
Sail C R U I S E (2.5 - 3.5 hours) Dock	:15 - :20 Ceremony

The Bride and Groom typically board 30 minutes prior to sailing. This gives the crew and the couple a chance to meet and go over the preliminary details of a wedding on 'The Rose.' The Bride can take this time to 'freshen up' and relax for a few minutes

Guests board 15 minutes prior to sailing, and are guided upstairs to the main parlour where the ceremony seating is located. The Bride and Groom remain downstairs. Your wedding coordinator will prep you for your 'entrance'

Just prior to getting underway the Captain will give the requisite safety briefing.

The Captain and Groom will enter up the stairs, followed by the attendants, the flower and ring kids and the Bride. The ceremony will take place. Bride and Groom exit downstairs.

Bride and Groom stand in lower parlour area. Guests walk downstairs and greet the couple then proceed to the buffet area to eat all of the food before the bride and groom get there.

Bride and Groom go to the buffet, sit, eat, visit with other guests.

After eating the certificate is signed upstairs at the cake table or on the table in the lower parlour.

More visiting, as the crew passes the toast beverage The photographer will want to get a shot of the Bride and Groom pouring each others beverage. The Toast happens in front of the cake table, then the couple turns and cuts the cake, then the 1st dance and other (dad/ daughter, mom/son, etc) dances happen.

At this point sponaneous partying, joculariry and generally frivolous behavior breaks out -go with the flow.

If you decide to remove and throw the bouquet and garter, do it later on in the party.

Just prior to docking your wedding coordinator will take you down to the buffet area away from your guests. This makes the 'exit' from the boat much smoother.

All of your guests are lined up along the dock waiting for you to exit.
